Dear Parents/ Caregivers

Welcome back to a jam-packed term of public speaking, performing, Financial Literacy and so much more!

The Term 3 programme overview is attached.

Here are some key points about the upcoming term:

<u>Literacy:</u> We begin the term by getting straight into our speech writing unit. Students will be analysing well-written speeches so they can ultimately write and perform their own. Students will perform their speeches in week 5 of this term. Representatives from each class will be chosen for the whole syndicate semi-finals. Finally 8-10 students are selected to speak during Speech Finals Night on Thursday the 28th August (Week 7).

<u>The Performance: A Dance Through Time:</u> This term the school will be putting on a small dance performance. Each teacher will be designing a dance with their class, themed to a particular time in history. Every student will be a part of this opportunity either on stage, or behind it.

<u>Mathematics:</u> For maths this term, we will continue to work through the resource "Maths No Problem" as well as integrate our topic focus of Financial Literacy.

<u>Banqer:</u> As mentioned above, our topic this term is financial literacy. Students will learn about income and expenditure, taxes, insurance, stocks and property investment through Banqer, which is a digital banking system.

<u>Kapa haka and te reo Māori:</u> This will happen each Tuesday afternoon across the syndicate. We will sing waiata and take part in games and activities that help to reinforce our use of te reo!

<u>Kiva and Digital Citizenship</u>: We continue to teach Kiva (our anti-bullying programme) as well as exploring Digital Citizenship and how to be safe online.

Home-learning:

- Steeple Rock Challenge: The expectation is for all Y7/8 students to complete 5 challenges by the end of the
 year, with a minimum expectation of 1 per term. Challenges will be shared during the last week of each term.
 The challenge needs to be well prepared, should be 2-3 minutes long and should include evidence of some kind.
 Earning money towards our end of year camps is a way of helping your child to better appreciate these fantastic
 experiences.
- 2. Reading: 20-30mins at least 4 times a week.
- 3. Extra learning Task: this will vary depending on our classroom focus.
