She will also continue to teach in Room 9, but mainly in the phonics and maths programme.

Term 3 Learning Focus

There will be performances in week 9 of the term (**9 - 12 September**). Our classes have already started their creative dance development in Term 2, when they participated in a series of energetic and fun dance workshops with Jari from Dance Curriculum. The theme for this inquiry is Inside our Bodies.

Formal Enrichment Programme

The Formal Enrichment programme will be running on Weeks 1, 2, 4, 6, 8 and 10.
